Dear Friends, I don't know v

I don't know what to say. Honestly, I am just exhausted. And out of words. Ten months of lock -downs and re-

strictions, mask wearing and physical distancing. Daily contagion rates that continue to climb after holiday gatherings and daily death rates determined to set new records every week. As I write this, 4022 people died in America yesterday from Covid-19 related issues. That is twice the daily average from November 1st. For those of you caught in the same time-warp-weeks-feel-like-years-and-days-like-hours-

continuum I find myself in - that was only two months ago.

I am tired. I am tired of smelling like hand sanitizer. I am tired of not going to restaurants and movies. I am tired of not seeing friends and family. I am tired of Zoom. But mostly, I am tired of people getting sick and people dying. Every day feels like it is mired in some anticipatory suspension where I am just waiting for the next phone call, text, email, or social media post announcing someone else I know has this thing. My wife's aunt got it over the holidays - she still can't walk across the room without getting winded. One of my mother's oldest friends, the woman who timed my mother's contractions when she was pregnant with me, got it last month she died. Another friend got it,

and he was fine: quarantined at home for two weeks, he had mild cold-like symptoms and rewatched the Marvel Cinematic Universe from his couch. There is no rhyme or reason for it - some get it and are fine, some get sick, some die.

But as I wait; wait to see who gets it or wait to get it, I am tired and I am weary. I am telling you this because many of you are tired as well.

When we get tired, we feel our isolation growing. Our fears seem bigger. Our aggravations seem worse than before. Our irritations grow to angers faster. And our faith can feel strained, distant, foggy, and small. So today, when I feel small, and tired, and wondering - I share with you this piece of God's Word from Psalm 27 - not that it would solve all of our problems necessarily, but that it might be a salve for today, comforting us, lifting us, and strengthening us. So take this Word, read it, take it with you for the rest of today. Get to tomorrow. God Bless.

Hear, O Lord, when I cry aloud, be gracious to me and answer me!

'Come,' my heart says, 'seek his face!'

Your face, Lord, do I seek. Do not hide your face from me. I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living.

Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage.

1. Masks, covering your nose and mouth, are required. This means

masks will be worn while in worship, sitting in the pews, waiting for the elevator, or walking in hallways or to your car with others. If you don't wish to wear a mask 100% of the time while inside the building, we under-



stand, please stay home and join us online.

2. You must maintain at least 6-feet of physical distance from those not in your immediate household/family.

To facilitate this, you must sit only where there is blue tape marking the pews, Please be mindful of others not in your household and keep an appropriate distance while entering/exiting, in



worship, while waiting for the elevator, or using the stairs.

3. We must insist, if you do not feel well, or are exhibiting ANY symptoms, PLEASE STAY HOME and worship online. If you are at a higher risk for difficulties with Covid, including being over the age of 70, with extenuating health issues, please stay home and join us online. The health and safety of all our members is of paramount importance.

For our churches. Help us to find our way forward to be the serving living embodiment of the Body of Christ in difficult and trying times.


Names added to the prayer list will remain on the prayer list for one month. Let the office know if a prayer request needs to stay on the list for longer or shorter than one month.

# **COVID-19 VACCINE NEWS**

JOHNSON COUNTY, Mo. — County officials are trying to figure out who wants to get a COVID-19 vaccination within the next phase of the rollout plan. The Johnson County Department of Health & Environment announced they are nearing the end of Phase 1 of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment's vaccination plan. Officials said they think they can move on to the next phase in the beginning of February.

Phase 2 includes residents 65 years old and older, people in "congregate settings," high-contact critical workers and those still unvaccinated in the previous phase.

To find out who in the next phase wants a vaccine, Johnson County has put together a survey. The online tool will allow the county to notify residents when the vaccine is available and how they can sign up. The survey will ask about age, occupation, contact information and more. Go to:
