Dear Friends,

I met recently with Board members on a Zoom call as we discussed when we might be able to re-open the church for In-Person Worship safely and responsibly. Given that we had five members who had been present in worship contract Covid and one pass away in the past two months, it is, to say the least, an important and serious discussion. During the conversation, one Board member noted that when she had talked with a member of the congregation, they wondered aloud, "Who is making these decisions?". This is an important question and it is important that we all understand the answer.

In many denominations, decisions are made in a hierarchical structure, meaning a bishop or other denominational authority figure makes decisions that are handed down to congregations. However, Disciples of Christ are a congregationally-based denomination, meaning the congregation holds the ultimate say in leadership and direction. You, the members, select and elect the Elders and Deacons who form

our Board. They are chosen from the congregation, nominated and voted on at the annual Congregational Meeting in late October, to serve.

We are a church of less than 100 people. You know the Elders and Deacons. They are friends and family. Those who serve are US, nominated by US, voted on by US.

If you feel called to offer your wisdom and perspective to discussions like this, we need you there. You can volunteer to serve as a deacon or elder when nominations are made in the fall. At the congregational meeting, if not already nominated, you can be nominated from the floor and voted on. Even if not selected to serve in this manner, the Board meetings are open meetings. Any member can attend Board meetings and participate in discussions, though only Elders and Deacons may vote.

At times decisions to not meet inperson are made by myself and the Board chair (For instance, during inclement weather). At other times, this fall for instance, leadership in the form of Elders, Deacons, Trustees, and Committee Chairs are brought in to weigh in.

And at times the whole congregation is asked for input, as we are currently seeking.

These are difficult times, and we are dealing with big decisions. Please know that neither myself,

nor our current leadership take these decisions lightly. We try to weigh all the factors and make the best decision for the church. At times we will get it wrong, and at times we will get it right. But through it all, we move forward together, as church; as Disciples.

Please be in prayer for our current leadership, and for the decisions they must wrestle with. Pray for wisdom, for compassion, and for grace on each one who answered the call to serve the church this year in this way. Surround them with your love and your kindness as they seek to guide us as best as they can this year. It will not be an easy year, just as the last one was not an easy year. But we face it together, whatever may come.




