CHURCH CANCELLED FOR SUNDAY, MARCH 15TH

After careful consideration and discussions with other church leaders and other churches in the area, we have decided to cancel all services and Sunday school for this Sunday, March 15th.

Dear Friends,

This has been a harrowing week. The stock market has deeply adjusted, major sporting events are being suspended, travel is restricted, and grocery store shelves are being emptied of supplies. The COVID-19 virus has been classified as a pandemic and its impact and affect on our world is being sharply felt all over. In a time such as this, fear and panic can easily overcome us. As we figure our way through we remember Jesus' words in the boat, when the storm seemed at its worst: Do Not Fear

And so we go forward together as the body of Christ, not in fear, but in preparedness. Not in panic but in cautious preparation. Over the next few days and weeks we will need to adjust how we do some things to help keep everyone safe during this time of heightened awareness.

Some things to keep in mind: Get your information about this pandemic from reliable sources such as the CDC, Center for Disease Control and Prevention https://www.cdc.gov, and WHO, World Health Organiza-

tion https://www.who.int/. or even the county public Health Department. Next, take common sense precautions. Wash you hands regularly. Avoid touching your face/mouth/nose. Cover your mouth with a handkerchief or your elbow when sneezing or coughing. Use hand sanitizer regularly. Avoid large crowds or gatherings/events for the time being. Clean all surfaces within hands reach (Counter tops, door handles, etc). Avoid physical contact. There is no reason for panic, but there is for wisdom. Let us be a church that is firm in our faith, prudent in our actions, a channel of blessing for our world, and confident in the sovereignty and providence of our God.

Lastly, be in constant prayer - for each other, for our community, for our nation, and for our world. Pray for those already impacted by this disease, and those who will be impacted in the coming days, weeks, and months. Pray that people take this moment seriously, and take the precautions necessary to keep everyone safe.

Jesus told us not to fear, and sometimes that is hard. But we are the Body of Christ, and go forward to help, to serve, and to support during these trying times.
