This election didn't bring out the best in us. Both sides are distrusting and wary of the other side. No longer do we simply disagree on policies or debate possible compromises. No, now we hate each other, despise each other, and write each other off as hopelessly stupid. And even though the election may be over, these acrimonious feelings are not simply slipping away. They continue to simmer and fester as we must now figure out how to move forward from here.

At this moment, Paul's words to the church in Colossae seem appropriate. In them Paul is exhorting the church in how to live together as Christians - how to put up with each other, how to get along, how to continue to focus on being disciples of Jesus Christ. "Clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another, forgive each other, and above all, clothe yourselves with love. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus.

I don't know what the next few days or weeks will hold. As for me, I am going to choose to follow Paul's advice. I hope you will too. God bless you, and God Bless our country.


We will have our Blood Drive Monday, Nov. 30th, 3:00-7:00.
