On November 17th we, you and I, will celebrate Ten Years in Ministry together. I was called as your pastor on November 17, 2009. Did you walk humbly this week, opening your eyes and heart to God's spirit? This is what God desires of us. This simple, straightforward instruction. Embrace this today as we did ten years ago. Make this verse our guiding light as we seek to be God's church in our community and world for another ten years together.
