Dear Friends, This will be our last newsletter prior to the election on November 3rd. I want to

encourage all of

you to vote. Make a plan, leave early, be prepared to wait, but vote!

This year, we have had to deal with all the tremendous physical and mental strain and suffering everyone is or has or will go through as a result of the pandemic. This pandemic has caused so much sickness and loss of life, the loss of income to many families. individuals and unbelievable unemployment and an extreme number of businesses that will never reopen. Now in addition to the multiple crises we find ourselves facing, we are thrust into the middle of a national election. To say that it be overwhelming could is perhaps the understatement of the year.

So this year, as a church body, as a member of a larger Church body in the Christian Church Disciples of Christ, as we go to exercise our civic duty of voting we are also going to focus on bringing some peace, hope, and grace to this stressful day. Along with many of our sister disciples congregations in Johnson County going to we are participate in a prayer vigil on November 3rd. election day, Here's how it will work: starting at 6:00 a.m. when the polls open

and continuing through 7:00 p.m. when the polls close, every 2 hours I will be sending out a prayer and devotional that you can stop and use throughout the day. I will send these through email, and also post them on our Facebook page. What I'm asking is that every couple of hours you stop and take 5 minutes to be in an attitude of prayer and reconnect with God on this day. As we do this we will be joined with our brothers and sisters in Christ as we pray for our nation, for our fellow citizens, for our leaders, and for ourselves. In addition I will also be posting a 30 minute prayer service that I and other disciples pastors recorded two weeks ago. this 30 minute service is available throughout the day on our Facebook and YouTube pages to watch and join in a time of prayer and scripture and song. As this election day arrives, go vote. You might vote differently than me, that is OK. We don't always agree and we won't always see eye-to-eye, but we can still come to the same table and break bread and share cup together. Know and understand why you vote and how you vote. Do your research. Read competing perspectives. Educate yourself on the candidates and the issues. The power to vote is an instrumental piece of the foundation of our country. Think about it. Donation cards will be requested returned by end of Nov. Committee voted to drop donation to DARF of \$250.00 from World Outreach. Finance is writing checks twice a month and would like all receipts in by middle of month.

H&G: Joel-Painting work progressing. Several new windows have been ordered to replace broken ones. Will be installed along with new wood trim, as needed, and painted. Crew is doing good job and church is looking much better. Roof repair over carport was completed 10/3. Rotted plywood was replaced on ceiling of carport and will be paint-

ed. H&G was going to set up for outside church service on 10/18; canceled, we will have service inside. Tables and chairs will be set up outside for Fall Roundup Lunch, depending on weather. Bob will meet McCarty at church on 10/26 for fall check/service of furnace. New sign base was installed 10/7and sign installed 10/13. There will be some upgrading done for the electrical connection. Furnace thermostats will be programmed by Bob and Rick for Monday-Saturday and Sunday. Antibacterial soap will be purchased and installed in dispensers in restrooms. A contract will be signed with Heartland Custom Siding for steel siding and small trim areas in white aluminum. Job can not be completed this fall; therefore, temporary repair to the siding to get through winter and will do the job in the spring to be done. Shingles over the carport and area to the north of it need to be replaced. Bids will be solicited. We received a bid of \$16,000.00 for tuck pointing on north end of church. We will look into sealing them this fall and continue to get more bids. Bob installed a new bracket on the chapel banner. The handrail going up to the sanctuary has been tightened. Bob and Rick replaced the steel door for the roof access. It has also been painted. H&G has been extremely busy this year with projects and more to come in the spring. A huge THANK YOU to members of the committee for hard work and our church member for their amazing donation. Our Lord has truly **BLESSED** us-our church is going to look amazing when this work is completed! **Outreach:** Carol-Summer Food Program completed. Harvesters will deliver Backsnacks 10/14 and continue through school year. Let Carol know if you would like to be on schedule to pack each week. Snacks and bottled water are being supplied to nurse's office at Hocker Grove. Cornucopia collection of food for Thanksgiving begins 10/18. MCC will serve JoCo Food Ministry on

10/29. Meal prepared and take-out boxes packed. Homemade cookies needed. Sign-up sheet outside office.

Membership: Allen-Fall Roundup hamburgers and hotdogs after church service on 10/18. Depending on weather, table service outside or to-go boxes. Next newsletter is 10/24. Four new members to assist with slides and videotaping in church services. **Pastoral:** Pastor Mark-We are continuing to live stream worship service, emailing the YouTube link out on Mondays. Decision was made to keep one worship service at 10AM until 2021 and re-evaluate based on conditions. We are sending out/posting to social media Children's Moment, Worship and Wonder, and Mid-Week Prayerful Meditation. We are looking to add an online Bible Study as well. In Sept it was announced that the following new outside groups had inquired about using space in the building for meetings: JoCo Water Board, Alcoholics Anonymous and Chukese Disciples Congregation. After much further discussion, it was decided that there would be no new groups allowed through the end of the year. The present groups of the DS Bus Co., Boy Scouts (adults only for now) and JCCB are allowed. Joel requested that he be informed so he can coordinate with janitorial services.

Personnel: Jackie-Nursery attendant, Maria, is having financial difficulties and suggested some assistance from church. **Trustees:** Bob-No report.

Worship: Pat-In recognition of Veteran's Day the Honor Guard will present colors during worship service on 11/8. Pastor Mark will be gone on 11/22 and will ask Bill Rose-Heim to present sermon. Pastor Mark will be gone on 11/29 and there will be no sermon but rather the Hanging of the Greens service.

Memorial: Emily-No report. Jim-When he contacted memorial funds regarding donations to new sign, he informed them that we will have a dedication service sometime in the future.

Old Business: Jim-Submits Nominating Committee recommendations of 2021 church positions. Elders and Deacons of early and late services combined into one. When we go back to two services, Committee will reconvene. Asterisks on report indicates positions voted on by congregation. Chairman Jim Owens made motion to accept the slate of Elders and Deacons and church officers for 2021. Bob Pape seconded the motion. There was no further discussion. Vote was taken of the Board and the motion passed unanimously.

New Business: Dixie-Submits MCC 2021 Budget. Postage and insurance increases, otherwise basically same as 2020. Mark suggested the Convention Expense of \$500.00 be removed as there are none scheduled. In addition, a few corrections in decimal points. Financial Secretary Dixie Wheaton made motion to accept 2021 Budget as amended. Carol Prentice seconded the motion. There was no further discussion. Vote was taken of the Board and the motion passed unanimously.

Allen-Upgrade of internet service would help with streaming of church service. He will check into these options with Spectrum and Google. Will follow-up at next Board Mtg.

Jackie-She will remind JoCo Election to follow sanitation guidelines at MCC on 11/3. Carol Prentice-Appreciate how nice church and lawn looks.

Allen-He would like church to have an understanding (guidelines) of what types of groups are able to use church building. Such as groups who "help others," rather than business organizations. Due to COVID, need to wait on accepting any new groups. Jackie-Thank you for everyone supporting

the Zoom meetings when we were unable to meet in person.

Pastor Mark closed with prayer.
