Dear Friends,

The second Sunday after Easter is traditionally a time to focus on the disciples

and Jesus appearing to them after the resurrection. In this story, inevitably, we run into Thomas, who misses Jesus' first visit. When informed of the miracle sighting, Thomas is uncertain and doubtful. He wants to see the risen Jesus as well, wants to know that Jesus is back. One week later, Jesus reappears and Thomas' uncertainty and doubt is put to rest as Christ comes proclaiming, "Peace be with you." Often we view Thomas with a little disdain and incredulity: how could he possibly doubt that Christ had come back? Hadn't Jesus talked about this event? Hadn't he spoke to them of his coming back from the grave? How dare Thomas not offer a fullthroated apologetic in defense of his belief in Jesus' Resurrection. How could Thomas be so...uncertain...about his faith? But I applaud Thomas' questions and doubts. His uncertainty is a necessary, vital part of a strong faith journey. It is only through doubt and questioning and wrestling with the hard parts of faith that our faith will grow. For Thomas, his uncertainty arose after a week of ups and downs, in which Jesus and his disciples had entered Jerusalem

in triumphant splendor only to see it all come crashing down in the pain and anguish of the crucifixion and death of Jesus. How could his faith not be shaken and trembled by the week that had been? For us, our uncertainty arises when faith meets life head on: in crisis, in tragedy, in success, in hardship, in loss, or in injury. When we face life's ups and downs, it is in the rise and fall that our faith ebbs and flows. We begin asking questions that do not have easy answers. We quit accepting weak platitudes that only serve to make the speaker feel more comfortable in an uncomfortable situation. We wrestle and argue with God, demanding to see behind the curtain and know the answer to hardest question of all: why.

For faith to be able to stand the tragedies and triumphs of this world, it must be run through this ringer eventually. Sooner or later, we all ask the questions that have no good answers. Sooner or later we will all pause in our doubts for a moment. When that time comes, may we be as Thomas, who, while full of question, found himself face-to-face with Jesus and in that moment surrendered completely, declaring, "My Lord and Savior."

Mike called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Emily-Walk in Your Light

Minutes of 3/08/22 Board Meeting: Mike asked the board to review the minutes; Motion to accept report by Michelle Land; seconded by Pam Boyd; board vote, approved.

Current Financial Report: Mike asked the board to review the current financial report; Motion to accept report by Emily Hooker; seconded by Pat Reed; board vote, approved.

Committee Chair Reports:

Clerk: Pastor Mark on behalf of Betty-Alpha Wickham passed away March 12, 2022/joined April 11, 1993 and Donna Ward passed away March 18, 2022/she and husband Arnold joined November 20, 1955; Arnold passed away May 14, 2018; total membership 142.

DWM: Pam-On March 17 we had the pleasure of setting up and serving a meal to Alpha Wickham's family following her funeral service. We were able to hold our monthly meeting on March 17 with nine ladies in attendance. We agreed to place the "FELLOWSHIP ON THE LEAST COIN" container on the table outside of the office for all members to deposit their pennies. These monies will go to the National Christian Women United to administer. On April 2 we set up and served a meal for the Railsback family following the funeral service for Larry Railsback. ReZound Bell Choir provided us with a very successful Spring Program on April 9. Prior to the concert we provided a dinner for the performers. It was wonderful to see the sanctuary filled with people enjoying the concert. Our THANKS to everyone who assisted with these events. **Elders:** Pastor Mark-Met with Elders & Deacons after worship on 4/10 for prayer and scriptures. Will be reintroducing Elders and Deacons into worship service on Easter and moving forward.

H&G: Joel-Bob and Rick put up the Star Burst in the sanctuary prior to Palm Sunday. Spring service by McCarty on air conditioning units. All were good except for Unit No. 4, which lost its freon again, and needs to be replaced. Received a bid on a Trane Unit in stock now. If sold and need to reorder, may take a long time to receive. Bob replaced all light bulbs in library with 100 watt LED, much better lighting now. Bob replaced 8' lights in kitchen; however, they did not work indicating the ballast is bad. He will get two new light fixtures to match the others. Bob was able to use the lift used by the tuck point repair guys to replace four light bulbs in the parking lot. One light does not work. It may be a ballast or something else. If Bob is unable to figure out the problem, we will need to hire a lighting company. The three replaced lights are much brighter now. The tuck point work is progressing nicely. The repairmen did point out that the metal braces over the windows are all rusted and in danger of collapsing. They need to be replaced as soon as possible. MTS can give us a bid for this work. A second problem is because of the water getting into the church, the plaster is cracking badly and falling off the wall all around the windows. We will get bids for this work. Due to low funds, we have decided to put our parking lot and sidewalk repairs on hold until we receive bids for the above work.

Outreach: Pam-Items collected during March delivered on April 4 to Free Hot Soup. They are very grateful for our continued support. She expressed the need for bottled water since most of these people live in tents and their only access to water is through this donation. We will make this a priority this month and throughout the coming season. Our weekly Back Snack request from Merriam Park Elementary has dropped to 50. We will receive a list of needs for our Summer Delivery Program within the next week. On March 31 we prepared and packed 125 meals at the church--brown bag take out of peanut butter & jelly sandwich, applesauce sup, chips and cookies—which were picked up for delivery to Olathe for distribution. The kitchen is under renovations at Center for Grace. June 30 is our next scheduled date to provide meals. We continue our weekly schedule for Meals on Wheels every Tuesday.

Membership: Donna-Committee hosted Easter Egg Hunt on April 9 with 9 children participating. After hearing an Easter story by Pastor Mark, playing some games and hunting eggs, all children went home happy with lots of candy. Upcoming activities will be Mother's Day and Father's Day. Coffee Hour on May 1st will be hosted by the House & Grounds Committee.

Memorial: No report.

Pastoral Relations: Pastor Mark- Committee met tonight. Next meeting will be 7/12/22 at 6 pm. PRC will host June Coffee Hour.

We will have a Maundy Thursday Service April 14th at 6:00 pm which will focus on the Lord's Table. THANK YOU to Membership Committee for organizing the East Egg Hunt. A big THANK YOU to DWM for hosting the ReZound concert. It was a rousing success with a full sanctuary! We have had several service opportunities this month, including serving two funeral meals & packing meals for Johnson County Food Ministry. THANK YOU to everyone who helped with these ministries. THANK YOU to Mike Nichols who helped me get the new office phone working correctly for outgoing and incoming calls. The calls still go to the app on my cell phone as well so I can answer when I am not here. We continue to work with Web Sites, after Easter I hope to get this done. I had the opportunity to help Bruce & Katie Roach move into their new home with my truck & trailer. They were very excited to move in after a long search for their new home. I performed thirteen funerals and one wedding this month.

Regional Report-Pastor Mark-I continue to serve with our Regional Board as Secretary and am involved in ongoing discussions about the future of Tall Oaks campsite. We are examining and exploring the current state of Tall Oaks, what it will take to get it solvent and what options are available moving forward. These conversations are ongoing, but if we cannot find a way to make Tall Oaks work financially, we will need to consider selling the property.

Trustees: Michelle-Investment better returns last month.

Worship: Pastor Mark-A Maundy Thursday Service will be held on April 14 at 6 pm.

Old Business: None New Business:

Joel-The air conditioning Unit No. 4 needs to be replaced. Received bid, with 5% discount including delivery and installation, in the amount of \$6,089.50. After discussion, Motion to purchase the new unit by Joyce Luke; seconded by Michelle Land; board vote, approved.

Bob-Pastor Mark addressed the Merriam City Council.

Pastor Mark-Council was to vote on a ban on conversion therapy, a form of religious harassment regarding gender id. He spoke to Council in favor of ban. The Council did not vote but tabled the matter to a later time.

Pastor Mark-Current copier lease expiring. The lease provides maintenance, toner, and support and is paid by the Regional Office. Information provided to board regarding extending the current lease on current copier vs. new copier with a lease. This information was previously discussed with the Region. After much discussion, Motion to purchase new copier with 60 month lease in the amount of \$245.74 per month by Joel Beaver; seconded by Michelle Land; board vote, approved.





