Wait For the Lord—A Daily Devotional

“Wait patiently for the Lord. Be brave and courageous. Yes, wait patiently for the Lord.” ([Psalm 27:14 NLT](#))

The New Living Translation of the Holy Bible references the phrase, “wait for the Lord” 24 times. The word, “patiently,” usually follows after “wait” or is included in the sentence. This daily devotional ponders how difficult it is sometimes to wait for God to act on our behalf.

Is it Possible to Wait Patiently? - Waiting for many of us can be very stressful, especially when we desire immediate results. Most of us want answers, and we want them now! We don't like long periods of slow-paced activities where nothing gets done except killing time with meaningless tasks. But, The Lord calls us to wait patiently with no strings attached, and this can seem unreasonable and demanding. Even so, it is possible to wait for The Lord; but you can't do it by yourself.

Examine your Waiting Habits—Take a look at your “waiting habits.” Do you squirm and fret when asked to wait in line or for a few weeks to receive a much-anticipated item? Are you impatient in traffic and indulge your frustration by blowing the horn or shouting?

Sometimes patience is merely the attitude we have while waiting. If we are fearful, angry, or fretful, then we are not acting patiently. The Bible is full of patient people and a few who were not. There are lessons we can learn from their behavior when we encounter trouble or unexpected delays. Our job is to wait for God with faith, expectancy, and peace; and watch as God Himself enters that fiery trial with us and frees us from harm.

Does this daily devotional message make you think about the times you've acted impatiently? Review your “waiting” habits, and then ask God to show you how to wait for Him.

Dear Father, I have exhausted my strength, trying to wait for You by myself. Show me how to stay calm and not jump to act until You let me know when it's the proper time to move.

Merriam Park Elementary School: I delivered two large boxes of school supplies today thanks to the generous donations from this congregation. Free Hot Soup: Water is needed! Our donations have slowed down but, the temperatures have continued to rise. We must show grace to these people who find themselves without permanent shelter. JoCo Food Ministry: We are scheduled to cook & park meals for 125 people on September 29. Center of Grace: Two large bags of children's socks & underwear will be delivered this week for distribution in Olathe. Meals on Wheels: We deliver every Tuesday. We could use more volunteers for this effect. It only takes 1-1.5 hours.
