Dear Friends,

The other day I was feeling low. Reflecting on the past two years, the interrupted lives, the health crisis, the

global pandemic and how they have impacted not only our everyday lives, but the church itself. There is no doubt the church is in the midst of a massive, transformative shift. To be honest this shift has been slowly gaining steam for 20 years, but Covid accelerated it. Suddenly, after the last two years, our Sunday morning attendance is half what it was, we have an online following, and our giving has shifted to mostly electronic through Easytithe. All of these challenges bring about a reckoning we all must face. The church as we know it is changing. As I reflected on this macro-evolution of church, I also took note of the micro changes and shifts we are experiencing in our everyday at MCC. I was a little sad, grieving what has been lost, and grieving my own inexperience and inadequacy with being prepared for what might come next. I was dwelling in this theological milieu last Sunday as we gathered for worship on Scout Sunday. Our Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts joined us in worship and we celebrated our connection and cooperation with scouting. Before the service I had let the Scout leaders know to inform their families and scouts that communion was available for anyone who wanted to take it and explained how we would do communion during the service. After the service I was talking with Scouts, their leaders, and their parents when one mom of a young cub scout approached to thank me. I assumed she meant the Scout service itself and told her how much we appreciated our relationship with Scouts. But she stopped me to say what she meant was thank you, because her young son had never had communion. This Sunday was the first time he ever was invited to the table and invited to partake. She was touched by this moment of grace and let me know what it meant to her and her son that day.

Mike Nichols, our Board Chair, reminded us at our February Board meeting that even with smaller numbers, even with fewer resources, even after coming thought the past two years, we are still church and we still make an impact in people's lives and this community. That young mother Sunday morning reminded me of that. We might be small, but God's grace is mighty. We might be weak but He is strong. Yes, the way of church is changing, that is inevitable, but we are still, regardless of size, numbers, and attendance, we are still church. Go out and Be Church today - touch someone's life and change someone's world.
