Outreach: Pam-Actively collecting items for our local homeless community, sacking and delivering BackSnacks to Merriam Park Elementary each week; as well as Meals on Wheels every Tuesday. We have joined forces with Free Hot Soup organization to provide warm clothing and sleeping items for our local homeless community. In addition to these items, we are contributing to their efforts to feed this community. Weekly each leader of eight areas in the Metro prepares 3+ gallons of soup depending upon resources and supplies. The soup is stored in a large cooler and transported to local parks to be served in disposable cups. They also provide each person with a bag containing a sandwich and snack items. The content depends on what is available to them. If there is any leftover soup, it is taken to a designated shelter. THANKS TO OUR CONGREGATION for always responding to those in need!

Membership: Jeannette-Committee discussed hosting the first "First Sunday Coffee Hour" on March 6th and have agreed that we can bake cookies and be ready to serve that Sunday after worship. **Memorial:** No report.

Free Hot Soup


