We tied it!!! And then we won, and the stadium erupted in cheers, but this family hung their heads as their beloved team lost. My friend and I stopped in the middle of our celebration to tell the family their Bills had played extremely well and they would be back, their quarterback is amazing. Through it all, even though we were rooting against their team, we tried to be kind. That was all, just kind. And as the game ended, I think they appreciated that kindness. Greg-Suggest forming an AV Committee with Chair organizing live stream technology teams for Sunday services, report to Board, etc.


Open Forum:
