Greg called the meeting to order.

**Devotions:** Pastor Mark-Micah Chapter 6, Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly with God. **Minutes of 6/14/22 Board Meeting:** Greg asked the board to review the minutes; Motion to accept report by Emily Hooker; seconded by Michelle Land; board vote, approved.

**Current Financial Report:** Greg asked the board to review the current financial report; Motion to accept report by Rick Ferguson; seconded by Joel Beaver; board vote, approved.

### Committee Chair Reports:

**Clerk:** Betty-No changes. Total membership is 142.

DWM: No report.

Elders: No report.

**H&G:** Joel-Committee met on July 5. The flat roof repair has been completed by Badger Roofing. With all our roof leaks stopped (new roofs) and with the brick tuck pointing work completed, we are going to start addressing the plaster (dry wall replacement). The areas are the choir loft, steps from sanctuary to fellowship hall, and around the windows on east side of fellowship hall. We will meet with Dave Ramsey for our initial review of these areas to get his thoughts. We will move forward from there. We are also moving forward with bids for concrete sidewalks, drainage area replacement as well as asphalt repair, sealing of lot and painting new striping in parking lot.

**Outreach:** Pam-Johnson County Food Ministry was June 30, 125 meals cooked and packed for pick up. Committee met on July 5 and discussed projects going forward. Free Hot Soup picked up donations of bottled water tonight.

**Membership**: Jeannette-Committee met on July 5 and started planning the following events: Fellowship Hour/Mark's farewell party-Membership is hosting fellowship hour on July 17 in conjunction with Mark's farewell party. We will have a variety of refreshment items and PRC will provide decorations. Game Night-Game Night is back beginning on July 16 and will be held every 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday from 6pm-8:30 pm. Open to all adults and children who like to play cards or board games. Everyone asked to bring a snack and a beverage to share and your favorite game. Church Cookout-Membership is planning a Church Cookout on September 25 after worship service at the Disciples Place. The church will supply hamburgers, hot dogs and beverage. Sign up list will be located at the front entrance for side dishes and desserts.

### Memorial: No report.

Pastoral Relations: No report.

**Worship:** Pastor Mark-Worship met and discussed Pastor Mark's departure and what responsibilities will need to be done. The paraments were changed, with Bob and Rick's help, to green for the common season of liturgy. They will remain green until Advent, though the banners will be changed in late September to the fall banners (with pumpkins). Pastor Mark provided a list of all things he does for worship each week. It will be presented to the board for help on covering these areas. Immediate needs include someone to do Children's Moment, lead congregational singing, and put liturgy together and send to the liturgist.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Mark-This is my final Pastor's Report to the Board of Merriam Christian Church. It has been an honor to serve as pastor here and I pray God will lead this congregation in new and exciting ways. I have several items to hand off tonight to the Board that will need to be considered

and discussed as you move forward. Things I had taken care of, responsibilities I helped with, and stuff I did each week. You all must decide what of this you will keep doing and who will do it, what of this you will lay down and not do any longer, and what you will do differently. Work continues with Webdeb Sites on updating our website. Jeannette Howe has expressed an interest in this and I will connect her with the company doing the work. I performed eleven funerals and three wedding this month. I must also discuss a required "period of separation," as I leave MCC as your pastor. In order for me to be able to apply myself fully to my new ministry, and in order for MCC to begin moving forward with their new ministry, we cannot have any regular contact, in person or social media, for a period of at least one year after your new minister arrives.

**Regional Report**-Pastor Mark-There will be a listening session on the future of Tall Oaks ministry on July 31 at 2pm here in the fellowship hall. Anyone interested in Tall Oaks and the ministry/camps there is encouraged to attend to hear options for what we will do next. These sessions are meant to share information and no decision will be made officially until the September Regional Board Meeting. Bob-Experiencing a glitch in production system where screen goes blank, Blue Fox looking into it. Discussion regarding additional training.

Bruce-Will contact Kyle with Blue Fox to schedule training possibly on July 31.

Jennifer-Suggests forming a media committee to work with Worship Committee, outside sign, newsletter and production team. Motion to form Media Committee by Bruce Roach; seconded by Michelle Land; board vote, approved. Discussion regarding Bruce Roach being chair of Media Committee; he accepts.

Sandy-She will be decorating Fellowship Hall on Saturday, July 16. Membership Game Night in evening can be held in an upstairs classroom.

Mark-The film crew, as discussed previously, will need access to church on July 19 and July 21. Joyce offered to be at the church to let them in. Mary Pruett is the head person with the film crew.

The copy machine company needs a meter reading every month. Jessica with Regional can provide it. The outdoor sign messages have been set up through September 13. Bob received training but has not actually done it; therefore, might contact the company to schedule a training session.
