

Evelyn's visitation is tomorrow at Amos Funeral home from 6-8:00 pm. In worship we celebrated Pentecost & decorated the sanctuary in red. We honored our loved ones who have passed on with candle lighting. I was able to do a special sermon with some pictures from my vacation and last Sunday we looked at how Jesus handled interruptions. This coming Sunday, we will honor the men of the church for Father's Day. The Fellowship Hour seems to be going well with people signing up each week. The Merriam Police did a walk-through of the church to help us with security. We have been working on internet at the church and trying to troubleshoot some of the connectivity problems. I will be the speaker for the Disciples Women's Regional Group evening meeting at MCC on 6/22 and have been working on "Ladies, Laughter and a Little Self-Care." **V. Deacons: Pastor Robin-ongoing discussion of role and responsibilities of Deacons.

DWM: Pam-We meet on the third Thursday of each month at 1pm in the library. We concluded our study lesson on "Forgiveness." This month we will start a new lesson entitled "It's Not Supposed to be This Way." Our May meeting was attended by seven ladies. We continue to collect empty Rx bottles which are distributed to area animal rescue organizations for their use. Plans are underway to host the evening Regional Meeting on 6/22. We will provide a meal for all; please confirm your attendance by Monday, June 6/29. Sign up sheet is outside the church office. We are looking for volunteers to help with set up, service and clean up. **Elders:** No report.

H&G: Joel Beaver-Update on Bats-the bat door was removed and location sealed; upon inspection of east side of church it also has gaps where bats can enter. I obtained the cost for sealing and recommend it be done. Audio/ Visual-Bob spoke with Kyle of Blue Fox about our sound & video issues; Brian from Blue Fox met with Bob and looked at the AV system, adjusted camera, checked the power supply on the projector, adjusted the volume on the lapel mic so it projected better and we have the left speaker working again, still need new connections. McCarty-Bob met with tech at church and found a bad motor on Unit #1, it is being replaced today. Unit #3 had tripped a breaker and was off, it was reset and is working fine. Damper is working fine, cooling issue was due to only two of the four units were running last Sunday. It should work fine moving forward. Nursery Bathroom-Bob replaced two rusted shut off valves and the lines to the hot and cold water handles. Leak stopped. He cleaned the P Trap on the sink. He also replaced the flush valve in the toilet. Holiday Closet-Bob installed all new hangers, so all the Christmas wreaths are hanging up again. Internet-no internet at the church; Google came and checked out their side of the system, everything is fine and it is supplying full power into the church. The problem is caused by something inside the church. Bill with the Region is in the process of setting up an appointment with someone to come and find/fix the problem. The Region will pay the cost for the repair. Parking Lot Light Pole-has been re-

moved and a new light and pole will be installed by Pro Circuit Electric.

Media: Jennifer-Average of 25 views on YouTube on Sunday; increase in views of Children's Ministry, website needs some updates. Greg-explanation of adjustments to mic volumes can cause some feedback. A third camera person is needed.

Membership: Jeannette-The committee met on 6/11 and discussed the following: Father's Day-special presentation during worship with help of our children; May Sunday Funday-great success with 25 attendees & an appreciated goodwill offering; June Sunday Funday-6/25 with Dominoes & Pizza & Desserts; July Sunday Funday-7/16 with theme of Ice Cream Social, Hotdogs & Cornhole; Annual BBQ-9/17 at the Disciples Place with hamburgers, hotdogs and buns provided with congregation sign-up for side dishes/desserts; MCC T-shirts-orders are due by 6/30, \$10 per shirt can be paid by EasyTithe, check or cash; MCC Directory-going well, waiting on a few pictures and survey sheets.

Memorial: No report.

Outreach: Pam-We continue to support our unhoused community by providing Free Hot Soup with bottled water. As the temperatures continue to climb, the need will increase. MCC continues to deliver Meals on Wheels each Tuesday. We are preparing for JoCo Food Ministry on 6/29; we will cook & package 150 meals; asking congregation for cookies; a sign-up sheet is outside the church office. We continue to support the following organizations with monitory donations: Salvation Army, Hospice, Crosslines, City Union Mission, Community & Family Services, Shawnee Community Service, Cancer Action, SafeHome, Sunflower House. Merriam Park Elementary did not request food assistance for any families this summer. Harvesters has advised they prefer that the food items we have on hand be used locally rather than return to them. We have suggested beginning our own "Helping Hands" pantry where we could use these items. The congregation could also be given the opportunity to take 1 or 2 bags to hand out to those in need which they might encounter when driving around the area. Shawnee Community Services is another option. **Pastoral Relations**: No report.



Do you know the top 5 Financial Fraud Scams?

Financial fraud scams are on the rise. Do you know how to response a Scammer? Here are the top 5 scams to lookout for:

<u>Government impersonation scams</u>—In government impersonation scams (also known as <u>government imposter</u> <u>scams</u>), scammers call unsuspecting older adults and pretend to be from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), <u>Social</u> <u>Security</u> Administration, or Medicare. They may say the victim has unpaid taxes and threaten arrest or deportation if they don't pay up immediately. Or they may say Social Security or Medicare benefits will be cut off if the victim doesn't provide personal identifying information. This information can then be used to commit identity theft.

<u>Sweepstakes and Lottery scams</u>—The sweepstakes scam is one many people are familiar with. Here, scammers call an older adult to tell them they've won a lottery or prize of some kind. If they want to claim their winnings, the older adult must send money, cash, or gift cards up front—sometimes thousands of dollars' worth—to cover supposed taxes and processing fees. Scammers may impersonate well-known sweepstakes organizations (like Publishers Clearing House) to build trust among their victims. Of course, no prize is ever delivered. Sometimes, fraudsters are able to convince the older adult to send even more money by telling them their winnings will arrive soon. Many continue to call their victims for months and even years after defrauding them out of an initial sum of money.

<u>Robocalls & phone scams</u>—Robocalls take advantage of sophisticated, automated phone technology to dial large numbers of households from anywhere in the world. While there are legal uses for this technology, robocalls can also be used to carry out a variety of scams on trusting older adults who answer the phone. Some robocalls may claim that a warranty is expiring on the victim's car or electronic device, and payment is needed to renew it. Like with government impersonation calls, scammers often spoof the number from which they're calling to make it appear as if the call is from a reputed organization.

One common robocall is the "<u>Can you hear me?</u>" call. When the older person says "yes," the scammer records their voice and hangs up. The criminal then has a voice signature to authorize unwanted charges on items like stolen credit cards.

<u>Computer Tech Support Scams</u>—A pop-up message or blank screen usually appears on a computer or phone, telling the victim their device is damaged and needs fixing. When they call the support number for help, the scammer may either request remote access to the older person's computer and/or demand they pay a fee to have it repaired.

<u>The Grandparent Scam</u>—The grandparent scam is so simple and so devious because it uses one of older adults' most reliable assets, their hearts. Scammers call a would-be grandparent and say something along the lines of: "Hi, Grandma, do you know who this is?" When the unaware grandparent guesses the name of the grandchild the scammer most sounds like, the scammer is able to instantly secure their trust. The fake grandchild then asks for money to solve some urgent financial problem (such as overdue rent, car repairs, or jail bond).
