Dear Friends, I am excited to announce I am a new Uncle again! This past Thursday my youngest brother and his

wife welcomed son #3, Darius Bascom Willis! Twenty inches long, 8.5 pounds, mother and baby doing great. I got to go help them this week. Originally my sister-in-law's mother was supposed to be there, but she unexpectedly came down with Covid last Sunday. So Uncle Mark got the call! My main support was to watch and care for their two older boys, Nile and Cyrus, my nephews. I was happy to help and glad I had some time Thursday to go up and assist them.

My nephews are great kids, but can sometimes have their peccadillos. There were moments Cyrus and I had to engage in a battle of wills. Nothing like going to battle with a four-year-old to prove who can be more stubborn! When their dad would call me to check in, he would ask how the boys were doing. When I told him about our skirmishes, he worried I might not like the kids and not come back. I calmly assured him I loved my nephews, and these short dust-ups were resolved and we had moved on to more fun things like Lego Batman and pizza. But I found it interesting how he reacted to these short stressful moments. My brother was concerned that in the unvarnished moments, I might become disenchanted with the foibles of children. I was not. I know my nephews are not perfect, and that is ok, because neither am I. Rather than turning me off, these moments reassured me of our con-

nection as family members. The Church is sometimes like this. We come in initially thinking everything is perfect, everything is happy go-lucky. But the longer we are in church (or any social group) we begin to uncover cracks, imperfections, mistakes, and issues. For some, this discovery of wounded people who need healing is too much. They leave disheartened and disenchanted with the Christians they found. But I have always found this discovery of imperfection reassuring in church. Because I am not perfect either. I need God to complete me. I need God to heal me. I need God to save me. And I rejoice that I have found a whole group of people in that same predicament. Thank God I am not the only one! That is the purpose of the church: we are a gathering of imperfect, flawed sinners, who need God's grace and God's love and we come together to find it; together. Don't be surprised to find out how un-perfect your fellow church folk are. Instead, rejoice in the communion you have found, where your flaws and sins don't disqualify you from membership, but instead make you the perfect church member. We come together not as a meeting of the perfected, but as a gathering of those who need to be perfected by a loving saving God.


Susan Bonjour's sister, Patricia Snow, passed away. Please keep Susan and her family in your prayers.
