Dear Friends, Lent has begun. Traditionally a time of year to consider how we have strayed from God and re-correct

our path to walk with God, Lent offers us an opportunity for selfreflection. Lent is a chance to repent, and turn back to God in our everyday lives. But there are always obstacles to this redemption. Temptation is a big one! We begin Lent each year by hearing of Jesus' time in the wilderness, after his baptism, when he was fasting and praying, communing with God as he prepared for his mission and ministry. During this 40-day-fast, Jesus was tempted, time and again by the devil, offering food, offering power, and offering salvation. But Jesus resisted, leaning on God's Word each time, he rebuked Satan by reminding him and us we do not live by bread alone, but by the Word of God, we worship only God, and we do not test God. In reading this passage every year, it is possible to hear these tests and trials as easy, almost simplistic to Jesus. But it must have been hard. Jesus must have struggled with these challenges.

When we see this story in the scripture, I wonder what led Jesus to share these encounters with his disciples. He was the only person there, so for us to hear the story,

he must have shared it at some point. Was it after the disciples had wrestled with temptation themselves? Had they lost the battle perhaps? Were they downtrodden and depressed because of this moment? Whatever it was. I see Jesus turning to them, looking in their eyes, holding their hand, and explaining to them he understood how they felt. Proclaiming to them that he too had struggled with temptation and faced trials. Soothingly saying to them, "I know, you are not alone in this." Jesus is saying the same thing to each of us. He knows our struggles, our slip-ups, our weaknesses. He has walked this path as well, and he understands. We are not alone.

As we enter into this journey of Lent to repent and turn back to God, let us do so in full knowledge that we are not alone, that Jesus is walking this journey with us, that he loves us, and that he understands what we are going through right now.


Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC)
