A few weeks ago at the women's retreat, one of the ice beaker questions was for us to pick which season energizes us the most and share why. We had to choose one of four tables to sit at, each with a sign: Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall. There were two people that went to the Winter table; the cold wasn't the popular choice! There were four people who went to the Fall table, who talked about the colors of the leaves changing. The majority of the women chose the Summer table- about twenty-five women who

shared their love of the warm summer sun, swimming, bbqs and just being outside. I picked the Spring table, along with about ten other women. Almost everyone at the table talked about the New Life that Spring offers to us- from the cold and death of winter, to the new blossoms and buds, baby birds, longer days, and brightening sunshine. One woman shared that she loves the rains of Spring because it reminds her how God fills us with the Living Water, so that we can grow and be rejuvenated, just like the flowers of the field. Another woman talked about all the newness of Spring time.

Her words reminded me of the scripture in Isaiah 53:18-19. ""Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." I love this idea because so often we do need to let go of the past, let go of the old, so that something new can grow. It can be very hard to let go of past hurts and pains, challenges, and patterns of behavior. It can even be hard to let go of past successes and victories. Sometimes letting go means grieving or working through layers of feelings, that we carry deep within us. But when we do, we create new space for God to work!

I think this passage from Isaiah tells us that God wants to do a new thing--Spring up new life within us, but we must be ready for it! We must prepare space in our hearts to receive the seeds God wants to plant. Just like the earth goes through very purposeful seasons and winter paves the way for Spring, we must be purposeful in preparing our hearts, minds and spirits, so that we can receive what God wants to do in us.

The Lenten season is about preparation- we are preparing to receive New Life in the Resurrection! What do you need to let go of? What past hurts are holding you back? Where is the space for God to plant seeds in you? Are you ready to embrace the new?



Greg called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Jeannette-Bless the Lord at all times

Prayer was offered by Pastor Robin.

Minutes of 02/07/23 Board Meeting: Greg asked the board to review the minutes; Motion to accept report by Bob Pape; seconded by Michelle Land; board vote, approved.

Current Financial Report: Greg asked the board to review the current financial report; Motion to accept report by Carole Prentice; seconded by Rick Ferguson; board vote, approved.

Committee Chair Reports:

Clerk: Donna on behalf of Betty-No change, total membership 137.

DWM: Pam-Due to weather, we were not able to meet in February. We will meet 3/16 at 1 pm. All women welcome. Blanket Sunday is 3/19. This project supports Church World Services. Any donation welcome; \$10 provides a blanket for someone in need. Our "least coin" jar is located outside the church office where coins are collected and forwarded to Church Women United national offices. We continue to collect empty pill bottles (pet rescue organization), old eyeglasses and can tabs.

Elders: Bob-Pastor Robin will choose a date and send notice by email.

H&G: Bob-Air conditioners-McCarty Mechanical completed spring tune-up; replaced a contact in one of the units. Video/Sound system-Kyle, with Bluefox Production, found a bad connection with our left speaker, ordered a part to correct the problem. He will also get the necessary equipment to hook up a DVD player to our system. Parking lot light-waiting on a breakout of prices of installation and parts.

Outreach: Pam-Harvesters-conducted a site visit on 3/10 and informed that we need to have all boxes 3" off the floor. Suggested using their pallets from their deliveries (cut in half). Merriam Park Elementary-They have reduced the number of backsnacks to 40 per week; Harvesters will discuss with them what factors they are using to determine those children in need and report back to us. I attended Caring for Kids meeting in February; nothing new to report. Committee met and discussed the following: A local non-profit Happy Bottoms who supplies diapers to help families. Programs like food stamps, Medicaid and WIC do not cover diapers. Harvesters Chicken Challenge-they received 56K pounds of poultry from Tyson and need help in sorting and packaging this product in their USDA certified repacking room to prepare the chicken for distribution to families in our community. Individuals can register themselves; however, groups of 6 or more can sign up to meet at their facility for 2.5 hour shifts Tuesday-Friday 8:30-11am, 12-30-3pm. JoCo Food Ministry-Thursday, 3/30, cooking and packing meals for 150. Need 25 dozen cookies.

Pastoral Relations: Carole-PRC will start meeting, Pastor Robin will provide dates; Pastor Robin

would like to attend monthly committee meetings to familiarize herself with what is going on with each committee.

Worship: No report.

Media: Jeannette on behalf of Bruce_YouTube updates-views from this time last year up by 100 views than normal. Watch time is up 56 hours more than usual. Gained three subscribers last month. Children's Moment views are up 50%. Last month we started posting them on our FB page. February 19th was one of our highest viewed videos next to our Christmas service. More people accessing on mobile phones; possibly indicating a younger demographic viewing but number of desktops/laptops watching remains steady.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Robin-this first month has been a whirlwind of activity! We celebrated Super Bowl Sunday, MCC's 110th Anniversary and my Installation. We also observed Ash Wednesday with a special service, and we are now in the midst of our Lenten Series: Unlocking the Doors of Christ: Messianic Prophecies. This month, I have had the opportunity to begin getting to know members of the congregation and learn more about MCC. Several people have stopped by the office or called me to visit. I have also made several pastoral care calls. I had the honor of attending and co-keynoting (with my mother) the Disciples Women's Retreat weekend 3/10-11. We did the main program for Saturday, talking about Light and Recharging. I also completed the first half of the Interim Minister's Training through IMN, which I had registered for several months ago. It has offered a lot of opportunities for reflection and insight into congregational life. We are planning a Maundy Thursday Service on 4/6 at 7pm. I am sending out Camp Registration to our youth for the summer season. I especially want to THANK EVERYONE for making me feel so welcome and for helping me learn more about MCC!
