Minutes of 10/12 Board Meeting: Carole asked the board to review the minutes and current financial reports; Motion to accept reports by Mike Nichols; seconded by Walt Bohn; approved.

Committee Chair Reports:

Clerk: Carole on behalf of Betty-total membership is 151, no changes. Discussion of categories of Membership: active, legacy, second generation.

DWM: Pam-Seven ladies in attendance on 10/21. Discussion: collection of hats & gloves for Christmas Bureau; empty pill bottles continue to be well received by shelter; Regional DWM on 10/28 at Independence First Christian; making & sending Christmas cards to Kansas service men & women stationed overseas via Volunteer Kansas. Agreed that on 12/16 instead of our regular meeting we will go to lunch at Olive Garden. All women of church will be invited. New program "Keep it Shut" will begin at next meeting of 11/18. **Elders:** No report.

Finance: Dixie-October financial reports provided for review.

H&G: Joel-Obtained bid from United Restoration for new roof. Discussion had regarding details of bid and breakdown of total amount, deductible, and insurance coverage. Recommend using United Restoration for roof replacement. They have done some roof repairs and roof replacement over carport and did a great job. Received proposal from MTS for tuckpoint brick surfaces.

Outreach: Carole-Thank you for all food donations. We will provide 25 boxes to Merriam Park and 10 boxes to Hocker Grove, if needed, or to Shawnee Community Services. Sunday (11/14) is last day to donate. Potatoes, crackers and mac & cheese are needed. Boxes will be packed at 2 pm on Sunday. For Christmas last year, gift cards were provided to families rather than purchasing gifts. That worked well so we will provide gift cards again this year.

Membership: Donna-Another Outside Fellowship Hour was held on 10/31 with hot cider and donuts. Membership discussed the possibility of future Coffee Hours with suggestion to hold a coffee hour once a month beginning in January 2022. Discussed activities for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Goal for a church potluck is Palm Sunday in April 2022.

Memorial: Emily-A sign dedication held on 10/03/21 for new digital sign in front of church. A printed notice listing memorial monies used and other donations was framed and is located on the wall above the Memorial Books outside the sanctuary.

Pastoral Relations: No report.

Pastor's Report: The majority of the new AV systems have been installed and first reports are excellent. Tuck-point bricks-after much discussion; Motion on tuck-pointing brick surfaces project go to MTS by Joel Beaver; seconded by Bob Pape; vote by Board; approved.

Coffee hour after worship service-Suggestion by Membership that beginning January 2022 we resume having a coffee hour in fellowship hall once a month, to be hosted by committee members. After discussion, Motion to have Coffee Hour on first Sunday of each month by Mike Nichols; seconded by Joel Beaver; approved.
