"Thank You" Opportunities



Mike called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Pam-Blood of the Lamb.

Minutes of 8/09/22 Board Meeting: Mike asked the board to review the minutes; Motion to accept report by Jeannette Howe; seconded by Walt Bohn; board vote, approved.

Current Financial Report: Mike asked the board to review the current financial report; Motion to accept report by Joel Beaver; seconded by Betty Bohn; board vote, approved.

Committee Chair Reports:

Clerk: Betty-There were no changes in August, 2022. Total membership is 139.

DWM: Pam-Third Thursday meetings continue at 1 pm in the Church Library. All are welcome. On 9/15, a new series about "Forgiving What you Can't Forget" will begin. Area evening DWM meeting will be on 9/22 at Hillcrest Christian Church at 6 pm. We continue to collect empty pill bottles for delivery to local animal shelters. Hats, gloves & children's books are now being requested for the JOCO Christmas Bureau.

Elders: No report.

H&G: Joel-Committee did not meet on 9/6. Dave Ramsey has repaired the damaged plaster (due to roof leak) on the East Stairs from Fellowship Hall to the sanctuary. THANKS Dave, it looks great!

Parking lot and sidewalk work was passed by the Board unanimously (email 8/31). Proposal will be presented to the congregation on 9/18 for a vote. I have told Golconda Group LLC to put us on their schedule as we cannot afford to wait two more weeks and hope they can complete the work this Fall. The proposed date to start is 10/3 and finish date 10/15. Depending on weather, seal coat and restripe may have to be done in the Spring.

Outreach: Pam-Committee met on 9/6 and discussed leaving budget consistent by continuing to support the following: Salvation Army, Hospice, Crosslines, City Union Mission, Community & Family Services, Shawnee Community Services, Cancer Action, Safehome, and Sunflower House. Plans are underway for starting up our BackSnack Program for students at Merriam Park Elementary. Harvesters is scheduled to begin delivering to us on 10/12. We are asking for help in the weekly repacking of these items. JoCo Food Ministry is Thursday 9/29. We will prepare 125 meals for drive thru pickups. Cookies are needed for this event. A sign-up sheet is located outside the church office. Meals on Wheels deliveries continue every Tuesday.

Membership: Jeannette-Committee met on 9/6 and discussed planning the following events: Game Night on 9/17 from 6pm-8:30 pm. This month we will have a pizza party and play dominos. Asking for anyone attending to bring drinks or ice. Game Night on 10/15 will be Halloween theme with costumes, bingo night with a chili potluck. Church Cookout-Membership is planning a Church Cookout on 9/25 after worship service at the Disciples Place. The church will supply hamburgers, hot dogs and beverage. Sign-up list will be located at the front entrance for side dishes and desserts. We are looking for a volunteer to bring their grill and cook. If no volunteers, Jeannette will cook.


